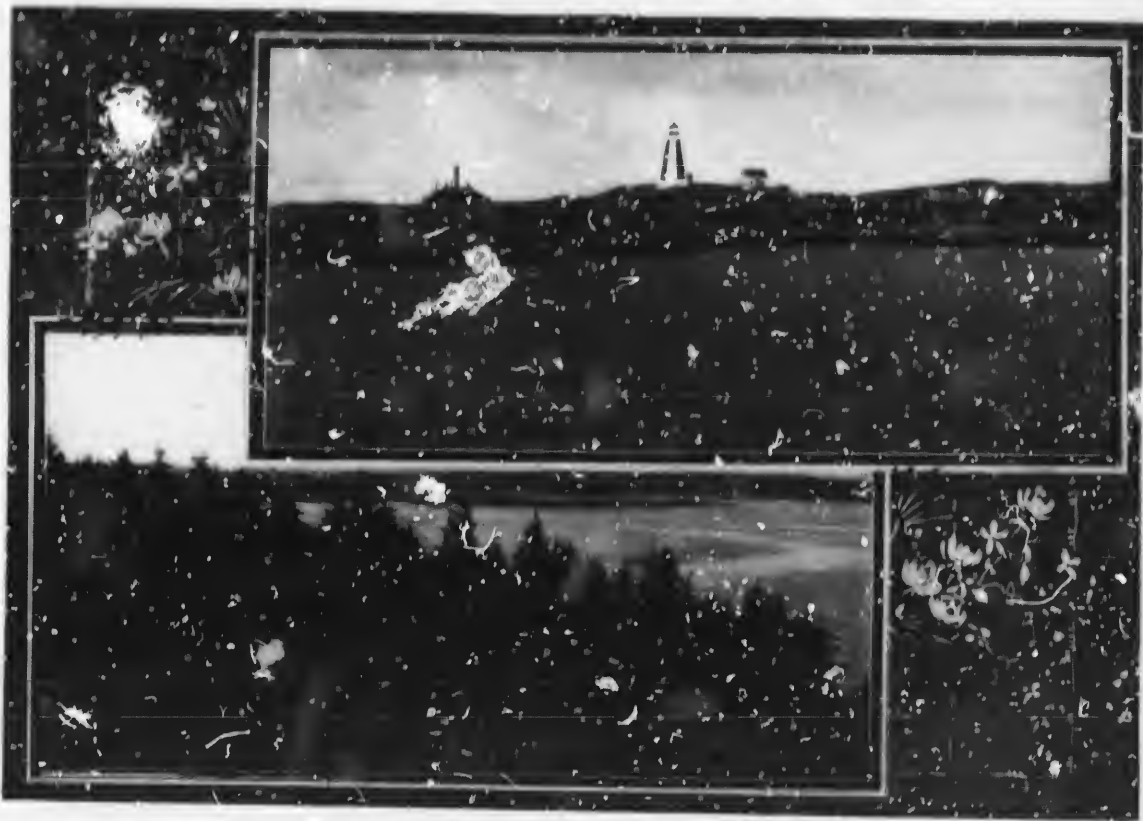


Yarmouth Light at the Entrance to the Outer Harbor.
