

# WILLIAM BAILEY FOUND DEAD

### Ward Seven Man Committed Suicide Yesterday — Robert Bouncer Was Probably Fatally Injured.

William Bailey, a man about 45 years of age, was found dead in the bathroom of his flat over a grocery store at 1715 Dundas-street at noon yesterday. F. Ellison, the owner of the store, perceiving a strong odor of gas outside the bathroom, broke open the door and discovered Bailey lying asphyxiated upon the floor with the gas tap left full on.

The police were immediately notified, and Dr. Gilmour of Keele-street summoned, but life had been extinct several hours. Chief Coroner Johnson was notified, and decided that an inquest was unnecessary.

#### Fell Between Cars.

Robert Bouncer, a brakeman, employed on the Canadian Northern Railway, living at 262 Maria-street, was killed yesterday afternoon in the yard near Sudbury. He fell between two cars while shunting, and the wheels passed over him, severing both legs and an arm. He was taken immediately to the Sudbury Hospital, but was not expected to live.

#### James Balmforth Dead.

The death occurred last night of Jas. Balmforth at his late residence on Murray-avenue, York Township. He was 48 years of age, and was a prominent member of Worcester Lodge, No. 41, Sons of England, B.S. He is survived by a widow. Interment takes place in Prospect Cemetery on Wednesday afternoon.

four squadrons would be in full commission. There would thus be thirty-three ships against Germany's twenty-nine. This might not, perhaps, be considered a very satisfactory proportion, but having regard for the character of the vessels, the arrangements proposed would, in the opinion of the admiralty, be adequate to the needs of the years 1914 and 1915.

#### More Powerful Cruisers.

Further the armored cruiser squadron would be replaced by more powerful armored cruisers, and a torpedo station would be established at Alexandria. The four Mediterranean battle-ships now stationed at Gibraltar, replacing the old Atlantic fleet, will be raised to eight as a minimum, reserving the two powerful vessels which are to be ready in 1913, to be provided
