Fall Trade Fairly Good.

Fall distribution of dry goods, clothing, hats and millinery has been of large volume at nearly all markets; there is a decidedly better tone noted in the boot and shoe and kindred trades, and the strength of cotton goods, the apparently in excess of that shown by the raw material, has been regarded as indicative of confidence on the part of the manufacturers. Bank clearings reflect the expansion of fail trade in a further gain in volume, but the stagnant condition of secunation, raricularly in stocks, precludes any important gain over recent years. Gross railway earnings continue to show gains over inst autumn's heavy business; but net returns point to much of this being used up in increased cost of operating.

Reports of damage to grain in shock in the Northwest, reinforced by Northwestern buying at Chicago, furnished the key to the advance of nearly 2 cents in wheat this week, followed by a gain of 20c to 25c in four and of 1½c in corn. Some of this advance in wheat was afterward lost in realizing. Other farm products were higher, pork and lard advancing on better export business and butter and cheese on improved weather.
