CANADA'S FOREIGN TRADE.

Reached Enormous Sum of \$414,-517,358 Last Year.

Ottawa, July 18.—Canada's aggregate foreign trade, according to a blue book just issued, amounted last year to \$414,517,358. This is a phenomenal record. It exceeds the aggregate trade of the previous year by \$36,827.673. The imports for consumption, including coin jand bullion, amounted to \$202,791,595, compared with \$181,225,389 in 1901, and \$121,505,030 in 1893. The value of dutiable goods was \$118,657,496, as against \$105,958,535 in the previous year. The value of the free goods imported was \$77,882,694, as compared with \$71,729,540 in 1901. The total exports were \$211,725,563; in 1901 they were \$196,487,632. Canada's exports of domestic produce alone amounted to \$196,105,240, an increase of \$19,366,048 over 1901. 
