Franchise Measure.

Crisis Will Be Precipitated if
the Irresponsibles Stay
With Their Attack.

Ottawa, June 3.—The most high-handed and unjustifiable action yet taken by the senate was taken last night, when that irresponsible body amended the franchise bill in a way to destroy the vital principle of the
