MEN'S BROTHERHOOD FEDERATION FORMED AT BANQUET IN "Y"

Chaplain-in-Chief of Imperial Forces Speaks.

STARVATION IN SERBIA

Gen. Davey Tells of Terrible Plight of Children of the Country.

Briefly referring to the war relief work of the brotherhood movements in Serbia, at the close of his address in the Y. M. C. A. auditorium Thursday night, Brigadier-General J. Henry Davey, chaplain-in-chief to the Imperial British forces, graphically, although in a very few words, told of the pitiable plight of 600,000 Serbian children, left destitute by the waste and devastation of war.

Two hundred thousand of these children not only had neither fathers nor mothers, but not even a single known surviving relative. Nobody knew who they were or what sufferings they had endured. For weeks and months many of them lived solely on boiled grass, chilies and lettuce, and so emaciated had they become that sores developed over the parts of their bodies where the joints of bones seemed to protrude through the fleshless skin. Their only clothing was rags wound around their shrunken, hunger-shriveled forms. Twenty-five per cent of them are tubercular.

No direct appeal was made for their assistance at the meeting, but General Davey stated that every \$100 would save the life of one child, and Rev. Byron Snell announced that contributions, large or small, might be made through the local office of the Christian Men's Brotherhood in the Dominion Savings Building.

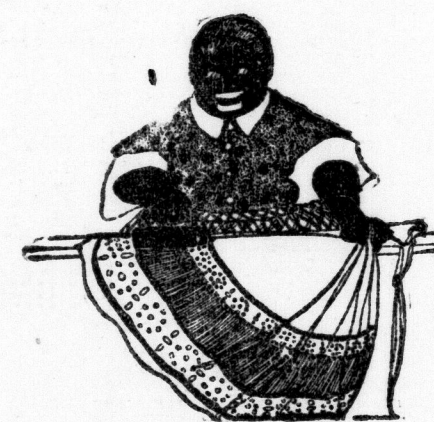
