McNair's a Describer.

Mr. Maclean's Question.
Mr. W. F. Maclean asked, in drafting tariff resolution No. 16, now before the House, did the Government consider how its operation might be affected by the following clause of Lord Ripon's despatch of June 28, 1895:

"4. While, however, Parliament has thus removed all legislative restrictions in the Colonies, so far as Imperial legislation is concerned, it will be necessary, in order that Her Majesty's Government may be in a position to give effect to the obligations of the Empire, and for the protection of its interests, to consider whether it is not expedient that a bill should be passed by the Imperial Legislature providing for the importation of dutiable goods from the Colonies, and to reserve for the signature of Her Majesty's pleasure, so as to allow full opportunity for its consideration from these points of view."

"5. For this reason, and in order to prevent incalculable loss which would be desirable, if such duties are included in a general tariff bill, that a proviso should be added that they are not to come into force until Her Majesty's pleasure has been signified."
