Old country soccer games down for today will probably result in home team getting a clear advantage in most matches, this being especially the case in Scottish League games, and those down for decision in the third division of the English League.

The Rangers should add another step to their league ladder in their game with Queen's Park. The best match of the day should be witnessed at Aberdeen, where the "herring-curers" will have to expect to at least draw the game. Airds are making a strong bid for the title, and by hanging on to the league leaders in the first half of a season, have evinced the spirit of a champion.

As the transaction, if consummated, will involve handing over the entire control and management of the companies in question, owing to the difficulty in transferring the actual assets comprising the distribution system in Toronto at this time, it is understood that all transactions shown by the books of the respective companies up to December 1, 1920, are to be considered as having been confirmed by the shareholders of the companies respectively and are not to be questioned by the purchasers as shareholders or otherwise.

All books, records and documents of the respective companies necessary, in the opinion of Mr. G. T. Clarkson, in connection with the operation of the companies, are to be handed over to the purchasers. All other books, records and documents to remain in the possession and be the property of the Toronto Railway Company.

If the proposal is accepted, a formal agreement is to be entered into between the Toronto Street Railway Company and the Hydro-Electric Power Commission. It is a term of this proposal that the legislature of the province of Ontario shall confirm the sale and the terms of the formal agreement above referred to and the same by the city of Toronto and the commission of the bonds forming part of the purchase price.

I have tried to set out in the limited time available the proposals that may have overlooked something essential with in the terms of our general understanding. If so, this can be added later.
