Montreal, Aug. 10-Some striking rea sons for the immense cost of street improvements in Montreal were shown to day when the civic royal commission resumed its sessions and Judge Cannon applied the probe to the dealings of the roads committee.

plied the probe to the dealings of the roads committee.

The main work of the day was in connection with the Modern Paving Company, which had secured a number of contracts from the city at high prices, but which it was shown did no actual work itself, but merely sublet its contracts at very much lower prices.

The company apparently acted as middleman for the securing and distribution of contracts. For one brand of stone it was shown that the company got from the city \$1.92 a yard and paid their contractors \$1.29; for Danforth stone they charged the city as high as \$2.54, while their sub-contractors were paid from \$1.43 to \$1.80; for artificial stone the city was charged up to \$2.11 a yard, while the people who did the work were paid \$1.20.

It was also shown that the company was getting from the city \$1 a yard more for asphalt pavement than was paid in Toronto.
