Ontario Glove & Morocco Factory.

W. E. PARMENTER, proprietor, Yonge street, Yorkville. Established 1869. Employs 12 hands and a steam engine of 10 horse power. Gloves, sheepskin Morocco, Manufacturers' leathers, druggists' skivers, &c., of the best quality are manufactured at this establishment, to the value of about \$30,000 annually.

Planing, Sash, Door and Blind Factories, Lumber Dealers, &c.

ATLAS WOOD WORKS, Front street, opposite Queen's Hotel, established in 1863, by Mr. John Clements. There are about thirty men kept employed at these works, and a steam engine of twenty horse power. The planing machine is kept so constantly at work that the shavings are sufficient to supply all the steam required. Sashes, doors, blinds and every description of builders' furnishings, are here manufactured.

CENTRAL PLANING, SASH, DOOR, AND BLIND FACTORY, 71 Adelaide street west, by Jacob P. Wagner, proprietor. Upwards of one hundred hands are now employed, and thirty horse-power steam is used to propel the machinery. The factory is fitted up with the latest improved wood-workers' machinery, and every description of wood moulding, turning, planing, sash, doors, blinds, &c., are manufactured.

W. W. COLWELL & BROS., lumber manufacturers—mills at Harrison's crossing; employ 20 hands; capacity, 20,000 feet a day.

BURKE'S PLANING MILLS, SASH, DOOR AND BLIND FACTORY, situated on the corner of Richmond and Sheppard streets, was established in May, 1867. Every description of mouldings, house furnishings, sashes, doors and blinds, packing cases, sawing, planing, &c., is done at these mills.

Sewing Machines.

GATES' LOCK-STITCH SEWING MACHINE FACTORY, 119 and 121 Bay street, established 1865. Employs 30 hands and a steam engine of 20-horse power, turning out about 4,000 machines per annum.

Piano-forte Manufacturing.

MESSRS. HEINTZMAN & Co., established themselves at 105 King street west in May,

1866. They employ about twelve hands, and turn out upwards of 60 pianos a year.

Canada Stained Glass Works.

An establishment for the staining and enamelling of glass was commenced in 1856, on Temperance street, by Mr. Joseph McCausland, now removed to 8 King street west, where fourteen hands are employed on house painting, glass staining, &c. The stained glass for the Toronto University, the Government Buildings at Ottawa, and the Government House in Toronto, were supplied by Mr. McCausland, as well as that for St. Stephen's Church, St. Peter's, and several other churches and public buildings throughout Canada.

Picture and Looking-glass Framing.

In this branch of business the leading establishments are Messrs. R. W. Laird, 79 King street west, and H. J. Matthews & Bro., 189 Yonge street. These establishments employ a large number of hands, and manufacture every description of gilt and washable gilt moulding, picture and looking-glass frames, &c.

Tin, Copper and Sheet Iron Ware.

WM. COTTRELL, 56 King street west, established 1866, employs 10 hands, manufactures every kind of tin, copper and galvanized iron work, roofing, &c.

Soap and Candles.

J. Carty & Co., cor George and Queen streets, employ twelve hands and a steam engine of six horse power. Messrs. D. Crawford & Co., and Wm. Matthews are also extensive manufacturers.

Vinegar Works.

BAY STREET VINEGAR WORKS.—These works were established in 1859, and are owned and carried on by Mr. Wm. Wilson at 115 and 117 Bay street. Mr. Wilson now employs about ten men, and manufactures every description of white wine, malt and cider vinegars. About seventy-five barrels a week are turned out. The vinegars here made have an excellent reputation, and are manufactured solely from liquors. Mr. Wilson is also extensively engaged in the manufacture of cigar boxes of first-class quality.

Wall Paper Manufacture.

M. Stanton, established 1825, employs forty hands and a steam engine of forty horse power. Capacity 700,000 pieces per annum.
