With regard to the attached letter addressed to the Minister from Honourable Dr. King, and with reference to the purchase of timber on the Tobacco Plains Indian Reserve, I may say that it is the practice of the Department to require payment in cash of a deposit of ten per cent In this connection we have to be guided by Section 5 of the Timber Regulations which is in part as follows:-

> "Each tender must be accompanied by "an accepted chaque on any Canadian "chartered bank covering the following "items!-"

> (a) Hental for one year.
> (b) License Fas.
> (c) Deposit of ten per cent (10%)
> *of the stumpage price and royalty
> *tendered as applied to the total
> *estimated quantity of timber on the
> *limit. *

In view of the practice of the Department in such matters, I do not see any way in which Mr. Nolan's request can be favourably considered.
