

2. Graduates in Arts of any College or University recognized by the Council will only be required to pass Three Years after graduating in attendance upon Medical Lectures, before being admitted to their Final Examination. No tickets for Lectures will henceforward be accepted by the Council unless it is endorsed thereon that the pupil had attended said lectures regularly.

3. Applications for every Professional Examination must be made to the Registrar of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, by the last Tuesday in March before such Examination, and no application will be received unless accompanied by the necessary tickets and certificates, and by the Treasurer's receipt showing that the fees have been paid.

4. Every Student commencing after June, 1880 (not a Graduate in Arts), shall attend Medical Lectures for at least Four Sessions of six months each.

5. Each "Six-Months' Course" shall consist of not less than One Hundred Lectures.

6. Every Student must attend the undermentioned Courses of Lectures in a University, College, or School of Medicine approved of by the Council, viz :

Two Courses of Six-Months each upon

ANATOMY,
PRACTICAL ANATOMY,
PHYSIOLOGY (including Histology),
THEORETICAL CHEMISTRY,
MATERIA-MEDICA AND THERAPEUTICS,
PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE,
PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF SURGERY,
MIDWIFERY AND DISEASES OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN,
CLINICAL MEDICINE,
CLINICAL SURGERY.

In Conformity with Clause 5.

Two Courses of Three Months upon
MEDICAL JURISPRUDENCE.

One Course of Three Months upon
PRACTICAL CHEMISTRY, INCLUDING TOXICOLOGY,
BOTANY.

One Course of not less than Twenty-five demonstrations each, upon
PHYSIOLOGICAL AND PATHOLOGICAL HISTOLOGY.

One Course of Twenty Lectures on
SANITARY SCIENCE.
