London Times Comment on The Arrest of Cardinal Mercier

The London Times says editorially of the arrest of Cardinal Mercier, primate of Belgium:—

The German authorities have arrested Cardinal Mercier, the Archbishop of Malines and Primate of Belgium, and have placed him under confinement in his episcopal palace. The news of this last exercise of German methods will undoubtedly create a profound sensation throughout the Roman Catholic church and all over the civilized world. We cannot but greatly doubt its expediency even from the narrowest standpoint of German military administration. Nowhere have the German efforts to procure condonation for their flagrant violations of public law, and to secure under false pretences a measure of moral support, been more conspicuous than at the Vatican.

The Emperor William, since his accession, has always shown the high political value he attaches to the influence and the good will of the Holy See. The arrest of a Prince of the Church for his conduct in the discharge of his ecclesiastical functions and in his own archdiocese can scarcely fall to give deep offence at Rome. Time when such an act would have speedily brought down on its authors all the thunders of the church. The Pope alone, by the canons, has jurisdiction over a cardinal, and it is explicitly laid down that imprisonment him is an offence which subjects all concerned, principals, aiders, and abettors, to excommunication, "infamy," and other penalties.

Cardinal Mercier is not only a member of the Sacred College, but a very distinguished member. He obtained, it is said, several votes in the late Pontifical election, he stood high in the favor of Leo XIII. and Pius X. for his mastery of the theology and philosophy of Thomas Aquinas, a mastery for which he is renowned amongst Roman Catholic scholars of all countries, and his authority and popularity in Belgium are immense. He is a champion of that moderate type which, in the eyes of the chief pillars of the Catholic party in the legislature and amongst the electorate, is the only sound and sane policy.
