HELD ON MILITARY TRAINING GROUND

Course Arranged by Provincial Department Has Been Successful

THE TEACHERS' camp in connection with the Rural Science School at Sussex is being reorganized this year, as announced a short time ago. The date had now been fixed and the camp will last from Wednesday, July 7, to August 4. The camp has been run during the last six summers and has been an unqualified success. The school this year it being held on the military training ground at Sussex, the course arranged by the Provincial Department has been successful.

The camp will be held on the military camp grounds, permission having been secured from the Military authorities to use the camp grounds, one of the bungalows, a certain number of bell tents, and other equipment. The tents will be fitted with cots; two to each tent. The location of the camp is less than five minutes' walk from the school.
