A special meeting of the Methodist monthly report issued by the Employment Service of Canada of its activities in Nova Scotia during May, it is shown that there is a great decrease in unemployment compared with the same period a year ago. Last May the service assisted in placing seven hundred and thirty applicants and at the end of the month had twenty-five hundred registered as out of work. At the end of May this year thirteen hundred had been placed and only nine hundred and sixty-seven remained unemployed.




