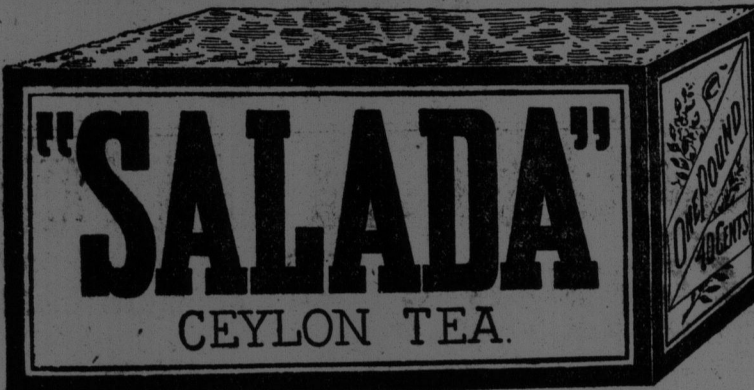

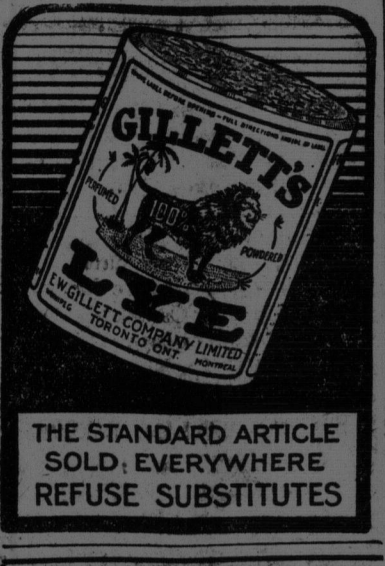

Missionary Conference.

Wolfville (N. S.) will, from July 24 to the 31st, be the scene of the third annual missionary summer conference for the maritime provinces. This is under the direction of the missionary education movement, whose main object is to provide training in missionary work for church leadership of all denominations. The work in Canada is directed by the Canadian council, composed of twenty-five members, with an advisory committee of twelve missionaries. Summer conferences have been or are being held at Whithy (Ont.), Knowlton (Que.), Brandon (Man.), Regina (Sask.), Edmonton and Calgary (Alta.). Among the speakers expected to attend the Wolfville conference are Rev. H. T. DeWolfe, principal Acadia Seminary; Professor

CHILD'S DRESS AND BLOOMERS.

Ordinary will make it very dainty from a decorative standpoint. For a child of average size 3 1/2 yards of material 27 inches wide are required. If bloomers are omitted, 3 1/2 yards will be sufficient. For separate bloomers 1 1/2 yards of 27-inch material are needed. The bloomers are cut from an open width of the fabric, but the remaining portions of the pattern may be laid on fold of the goods so that two sides may be cut at the same time. To make the dress first slash to the left of center-front on small "o" perforations; adjust underlap to position corresponding double "o" and slash large "o" perforations at back edges even. Close under-arm and sleeve seams as notched. Turn hem at lower edge of dress on double "o" perforations. Gather on crossline on single small "o" perforations and make five rows of shirring above 1/2 inch apart. Close back seam of stay, adjust under-lap shirring, centers even (single



CONSTRUCTION GUIDE. perforation indicates upper edge of stay), bringing the two small "o" perforations to under-arm seam. Adjust belt (small "o" perforation indicates upper edge), tacking front and to position, small "o" perforation over corresponding perforation in stay. Lap in back as illustrated. For the bloomers sew lap to slashed edge as notched, fold center, fall remaining edge over seam. Turn upper front edge of lap underneath and tack upper edge to position. Close leg seam as notched, close center seam. Gather upper edge between double "T" perforations. Sew waistbands to gathered edges, notches and centers even. Shir lower part on crossline of small "o" perforations and make five rows above, 1/2 inch apart. Draw in gathers the required size and adjust a stay underneath. Finish the neck and sleeves with buttonholes scalloped and French knots.
