Health and Beauty Answers

Clara: I made my faded "strings" sooth-
ing and healing and there is nothing
better to relieve enlarged pores,
muddiness and all roughness or redness
of skin.

Christine: For your yellow, pimply
skin, which indicates a liver upset, you
should make up and use the old-time
kardene into one half pint alcohol (do
not use whiskey) and then adding one-
half cupful sugar and hot water to make
a quart. Take a spoonful before meals

cause it eliminates from the system the
poisons causing them, and the timely
use frequently prevents seriousness of

Celia: You say "I am a slave to my

Antionette: Instead of making over
your gowns because you have outgrown

from your druggist. Dissolve it in
one half pint of hot water. Take a
teaspoonful before each meal and you
will see a gradual decrease in weight
without loss of strength or sagging skin.

Miss O: The "face cream without
grease" which you ask about is easily
prepared at home by this recipe: get
from your druggist one ounce of al-
mond oil, dissolve it in one half pint cold

DUCHESS, RED CROSS NURSE,
WEDS MAJOR FITZGERALD

London, Oct. 20.—Millicent, Duchess
of Sutherland, who recently went to
France as head of the Red Cross hospital
and Major Percy Desmond Fitzgerald
of the Eleventh Hussars, were married
last week at Rothampton. The duchess
has returned to her Red Cross work in
France.

The Duchess of Sutherland is the
fourth daughter of the Earl of Roslyn.
She married in 1904, the Duke of Suther-
land, who died in 1913. She is deeply
interested in social questions. Major
Fitzgerald was born in 1873 and has
served in South Africa. He was decorated
for distinguished service in Lady-
smith and the Transvaal.

DR. C. A. HODGETTS IS
SUCCESSOR TO COL. BURLAND

Toronto, Oct. 20.—Dr. Charles A.
Hodgetts, of Ottawa, formerly of Tor-
onto, has been appointed as commis-
sioner for the Canadian Red Cross Soci-
ety. He succeeded the late Colonel
Burland of Montreal, who died
recently in London.

Doctor Hodgetts for many years was
secretary of the provincial board of
health of Ontario, and chief medical of-
ficer of health for the province. He re-
signed a few years ago to take charge of
the health department of the Canadian
Conservation Commission, with which
organization he is still identified.
