Bitter Political Battles Expected as Result of Assas-

By THOMAS B. MORGAN Rome, June 24.—The first of a series Deputy Matteotti by Fascisti, was expected to start as the Senate convened this afternoon. Premier Mussolini was present to defend his Government in person as President Littoni called the

ession to order.

Littoni was scheduled to deno the assassination in his opening speech, after which Mussolini intended to defend the Government's action in to defend the Government's action in the case, and give a long statement on the new directions of Government policy. A communication from the Crown in connection with the assassination was also expected, although the King probably will not refer directly to the murdered Depúty.

Meantime the group of Independent Senators, opposed to the Fascist majority, agreed not to indulge in any demonstration after Mussoline's speech, but may introduce a resolution con-

demonstration after Mussolie's speech, but may introduce a resolution condemning the crime. Count Sforza and Senator Alberti probably will make brief declarations on behalf of the Independent group on a reply to the address of the King.

A section of the press today forecast that the property of Corriere Italiano, the editors of which plotted Matteotti's abduction which led to his murder, will be sequestered on the ground that RESERVATION OF STREET

abduction which led to his murder, will be sequestered on the ground that the publishing company is liable because of publication of articles in the newspaper designed to throw investigators of the murder off the trail Meantime police investigation continues, prosecutors questioning again all the prisoners held in connection with the crime, one of the most stirring of the long list of political assassinations which have marred modern Italian history. No trace of the body of Matteotti has been found, and the police believe

it was burned and the ashes scattered WRITES FROM PRISON FOR HIS BELONGINGS.

He was subsequently arrested in Montreal on another charge and sent to St. Vincent De Paul Penitentiary.
