her back. In conclusion, the Association expresses the hope that in new St. Andrew's the divine spirit of charity, self-renunciation and ceaseless activity may pervade the life of every member, young and old; that the Association may be increasingly helpful to the Church; that through us as individual Christians, and as a Christian Church, the kingdom of Grace may come to many a life and be greatly advanced in the lives of all believers, that the divine origin and abiding benediction of heaven upon the Church may be clearly manifested to all.
