A CHURCH SCHOOL FOR THE HIGHER EDUCATION OF YOUNG LADIES, UNDER THE GOVERNMENT OF A COUNCIL, CONSISTING OF THE LORD BISHOP OF TORONTO, AS PRESIDENT, AND EIGHT CLERGYMEN, AND EIGHT LAYMEN

The building is situated on a beautiful and well-wooded plot of ground, four acres in extent, in the City of Toronto, formerly the Homestead of the late Sir James Buchanan Macaulay, which has been greatly enlarged and refitted at very considerable expense for the accommodation of the School. The object of the promoters of the Institution is, to furnish a thorough Education on Christian principles at a moderate cost. Toronto being the head quarters of the Educational Institutions of Ontario, and the seat of two Universities, affords facilities in the way of Masters, Lectures, and Art Models, that can be possessed by no other Town in the country.
