That we have carefully examined the same, and would recommend that the approval of the Grand Chancellor be ratified excepting sec. 1, Art. vii., page 8, which conflicts with Supreme Lodge law, according to which every Knight is entitled to not less than the sum of one dollar for benefits per week during sickness.
