

We refer to the action taken on the sugar and molasses question. Mr. Lindsay and Mr. Austin very clearly and forcibly showed the effects of the very high imposts on sugar and molasses—imposts about equal to that on brandy—and demonstrated that the new burden it was proposed by the Government to levy on sweets would not increase the revenue and would affect our lumbering interests in two ways—namely, by increasing the cost of living and by preventing return cargoes being brought here from the West Indies. Mr. Lindsay moved, therefore, that our representatives in Parliament be requested to use all their influence against any increase in the duties on these necessaries of life.
