Cunard or Lower Cunard (sub. elec. dis.), a post village in King's Co., 4 miles from Port Williams Station, fare 15 cts., pop. 1435.

Cunard, Upper, a post village in King's Co., 4 miles from Kentville, it contains 2 stores, pop. 240.

Cannonville, a post settlement in Cumberland Co., 16 miles from Athol, fare 75 cts.; seven miles from Parrsboro, fare 25 cts., it contains 2 stores, 3 saw mills, pop. 770.

Canning (sub. elec. dis.), King's Co., a post seaport, 12 miles from Kentville, 6 miles from Port William Station, fare 50 cts. It contains 24 stores and 2 hotels; ship-building is carried on here; pop. 3265.

Canso, or Cape Canso (sub. elec. dis.), a seaport post town in Guysborough County, situated on Chedabucto Bay, 32 miles from Guysborough, fare \$1.25. It contains 8 stores and two hotels, pop. 1460.

Canso, a station on Cape Breton R., 79 miles from New Glasgow, pop. 10.

Cape Breton County, on the Island of Cape Breton, noted for the quantity of fish caught on its borders, capital Sydney, 1159 sq. miles, 748,000 acres, pop. 31,260.

Cape Canso, the S. E. extremity of Nova Scotia, lat. 45 deg. 17 N., lon. 61 W.—See also Canso.

Cape Chignecto.—See Chignecto Cape.

Cape Cove, a small village in Digby County, situated on headland near Cape St. Mary, 18 miles from Yarmouth, fare 75 cts., pop. 132.

Cape George (sub. elec. dis.), a post village in Antigonish Co., on the south side of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, 20 miles from Antigonish, fare 75 cts., it contains 6 stores and several saw and grist mills, pop. 660.

Cape George or Georgeville (sub. elec. dis.), a post village in Antigonish Co., on the north side of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, 40 miles from New Glasgow, fare \$1.50, pop. 700.

Cape George Harbor, a post office in Richmond Co., pop. 10.
