RYAN, *Lieut. Col. Hon. Thomas. C.*

Was for many years a wholesale merchant in Montreal, and Vice Consul for France, Consul for Denmark, the Hanse-Towns, Lubec, Bremen and Hamburgh. Is a director of the Bank of Montreal, of the North British and Mercantile Assurance Co., of the Montreal Mining Co., and of the Kennebec Gold Mining Co., and Lieut. Col. 5th Batt. Montreal Militia. Was one of the Commissioners appointed in 1865 to proceed to the West Indies, Mexico and Brazil to open trade relations between those countries and Can. Represented Victoria division in the Leg. Council, Can., from 1863 until the Union. Called to the Senate, May, 1867.—*Peel St., Montreal.*

SANBORN, *Hon. John Sewall, Q. C. L.*

Descended from an English Puritan family, which emigrated from Hampshire, England, to New England. S of Mr. David E. Sanborn, of New Hampshire, U. S. B. in New Hampshire 1 Jan. 1819. M. 1st. in July, 1847, Miss Eleanor H. Brooks, of Sherbrooke, C. E. (She died in December, 1853). 2ndly in August, 1856, Miss Nancy Jackson Hasseltine, of Bradford, Mass., U. S. Called to the Bar, L. C. Jan. 1847. Created Q. C., 1863.
