Proposal may scuttle regional condo groups

A proposal to decentralize Condominium Ontario into nine regional corporations could mean the death knell of regional groups such as Peel Condominium Association

(PCA) says a local man. Ken Oakes, a condominium owner in Park Royal, is strongly opposed to the plan, which was drafted by representatives of the Federation of Ontario Condominium Associations (FOCA) and representatives of the board of directors of Condominium Ontario.

The proposal calls for establishment of nine regional condominium corporations which would each have a three-man staff

dissatisfaction of FOCA and regional associations with the role of Condominium Ontario in its first year of operation.

Mr. Oakes claims any regional association which agrees to the plan is "signing its own death warrant." The proposed regional corporations are "grandiose, bureaucratic and unnecessary" claims the Bromsgrove Rd. resident
