of one dollar and a quarter per foot in . depth, for the first thirty feet; and for Swenty-five cents per foot additional, at the end of each distance of ten feet, until sufficient depth has been reached, to insure a plentiful supply of good water. The diameter of well to be five feet six inches, and the stone to be chosen by bonhactor, but laid on the ground by the Department. as the offer is regarded as a very reasonable one, the agent has been instructed to acceptit, and, may star that the description of the quality of the water, given by him, I can corroborate from my own personal Knowledge. The crubbing is absolutely necessary in order to keep the sides from falling m. Thad hoped that this difficulty might have been overcome, without the expense of digging a well, but fin that is the only way by which a supply of good water can be depended upon.
