Sir,

✓ Herewith forward communication from Messrs Maclellan Cline & Maclellan dated 10<sup>th</sup> instant also a decision arrived at by the Chiefs, to the ownership of a piece of land on Cornwall Island, between Thomas White and his son Matthew White.



The land in question is about half an acre cut off by the Railway Crossing on the west side of the track a three cornered piece. Matthew White stated that he occupied the land for the last 10 or 12 years and planted about 10 Apple trees on it, and his Father sold the piece of land to Chief Peter Oak, of Cornwall Island. I think Matthew would rather pay his Father than to lose it.
