SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Owing to the removal of the President to Kingston, and of the Editor and Secretary-Treasurer of the Company to Ottawa, in January last, it has been found impossible to have a meeting of the Directors so as to lay this Report before them for their approval. The Secretary, therefore, begs to submit as his Report the following statements:—

Shortly before the last annual meeting he asked for tenders for the printing of the Canadian Independent and Congregational Year Book, from four of the largest and most reliable printing-houses in Toronto, and the result was that the tender of Messrs. Bell, Hawkins & Co., was accepted for the printing of the former, and of Messrs. Hill & Weir, for the latter, theirs being the lowest respectively, and in every way satisfactory. In consequence of this, a very large reduction has been effected in the cost of these publications, amounting in all to over two hundred dollars as compared with the previous year.
