WATER WORKS**NEW LISKEARD, ONT.**

Sealed tenders will be received by Sinclair & Smith, Engineers, New Liskeard, Ont., until 12 o'clock, noon, on SATURDAY, MARCH 16th, 1907, for the construction of a Water Works System for the Town of New Liskeard.

These shall be marked Water Works Tender "A" or "B", as the case may be.

The above work comprises the following contracts:

"A"—Furnishing all cast iron pipe and accessories f.o.b. cars New Liskeard, Ont.

"B"—Furnishing all wood stave pipe and accessories f.o.b. cars New Liskeard, Ont.

"C"—Hauling and laying all cast iron and wood stave pipe, approximate 5,000 feet, ranging from four inches to four inches in diameter, doing all the excavating and back filling; setting all hydrants, valves and specials, and constructing valve chambers.

"D"—Furnishing and erecting a steel standpipe twenty-one feet in diameter and fifty-five feet high.

"E"—Protecting and developing springs on Lot 1, Concession 7, Township of Harris, and constructing a receiving basin.

"F"—Furnishing all material and labor for the construction of:

1. A concrete block pumping station with concrete foundation; concrete foundations for pumps and motors and also a concrete receiving well at pumping station.

2. Concrete foundation for steel standpipe with necessary clearing, excavating and grading.

"G"—Furnishing and erecting two 100 h. p. 3-phase, 60-cycle, 2,300 volt motors with all necessary accessories in the pumping station.

Alternative propositions will be received as follows:

1. Each motor to be direct connected to a multi-stage turbine pump, each having a capacity of 600 imperial gallons per minute against a head of 325 feet.

2. Each motor to be connected by an endless chain to a double-acting vertical triplex power pump, each pump having a capacity of 600 imperial gallons per minute against a head of 325 feet.

"H"—Furnishing and erecting two pumps each having a capacity of 600 imperial gallons per minute against a head of 325 feet.

Alternative propositions will be received on the following:

1. Two multi-stage turbine pumps direct connected to motors as described in Contract "G".

2. Two double-acting vertical triplex power pumps connected by an endless chain to motors as described in Contract "G".
