A Bill, intituled, *an Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Services of the Year 1790, and for appropriating such Part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of this Province*, was read a third Time and passed,

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to his Majesty's Council, and desire their Concurrence to the same.

Then the House adjourned till Monday at one of the Clock.

PRAYERS.

A Message from his Majesty's Council requesting a Conference by Committee upon the subject of the Appropriation Bill, and thereupon

Ordered, That Major Barclay, Col. Lawrence and Mr. Wallace be a Committee for that Purpose, and that they do attend accordingly.

Major Barclay, *reported* from the Committee, and stated the Substance of the Conference with the Committee of his Majesty's Council.

Then the House adjourned till To-morrow Twelve of the Clock.

PRAYERS.

The Committee of Conference conferred again with his Majesty's Council upon the Appropriation Bill, and Major Barclay stated to the House the Substance of such Conference, which being considered, and thereupon

Resolved, That the Speaker and the House do wait upon his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, and inform him, that on Saturday last the House had finished their Business, and that their Session being unnecessarily prolonged to the present Day, is highly injurious to the Members, and the Province at large.

Resolved, That the Speaker do request his Excellency to put an End to the Session, the House having no Business to transact.

The Speaker, *reported*, that he had informed his Excellency of the Resolution of the House to wait upon him, and that his Excellency was pleased to say, he was ready to receive them at the Government House immediately.

The House waited upon his Excellency accordingly,

The House being returned,

The Speaker resumed the Chair and *reported*, that the House had waited upon, and delivered to his Excellency the foregoing Resolutions; and that he was pleased to say he would take them into immediate Consideration.

On Motion the House *resolved* itself into a Committee upon the present State of the Province, and also to consider what Instructions are necessary to be given to such Persons as the House may think proper to send to *Great-Britain*, to assist the Agent in transacting the Business of the Province.
