The principal characters were all excellent in acting and singing the stage settings were appropriate, the choruses were good the children simply delightful and beyond criticism, and the little Blue Bells of all inimitable, of the excellent between acts features, in the writers opinion, the gems were Miss Marie Wilson contralto solo in which the rare qualities of her voice with its depth, volume, and carrying quality, combined with its purely feminine mezzo soprano like softness were demonstrated to the delight of the audience, the duet "Joan of Arc" beautiful rendered by Mr. Mason and Mr. Pick, and Miss Ruth Yould's highland Fling which dainty gracefulness of action and precision and correctness of step, would rival most professionals, and the writer knows because he used to dance it fairly well himself.
