#### FACTS ABOUT PEKIN.

For mine centuries, says the London Daily Express, Pekin has been an

In 986, under the title of Nanking, or "Southern Capital" it was made the headquarters of the invading Khitan Tariars.

A century later it was recaptured by the Chinese, who reduced it to an ordinary provincial city and rechristened

it Yenshanfu. In 1151 Tartar hordes of the Kin tribe took possession of the city, elevated it once more to the rank of a metropolis, built a royal residence within it and called it Chungtu, or "Central Capital."

Seventy years afterwards the Kin Tartars were driven out by Jenghiz Khan, who followed the example of the Chinese in 1080 and reduced it to a mere town.

Following Jenghiz, in 1280 came the great Kubla Khan, who rebuilt the city, called it Yenking, or "Great Capital," and held his court there in great magnificence.

t remained an imperial city under this title and under the Chinese names of Tatu and Khanbalik until 1368, when a Chinese succeeded the Tartar dynasty, and the modern City of Nankin, on the Yank Tse Kiang, became

the capital. In 1403, however, Yung Lo transferred his court to the old city of the Khans, and rechristened it Pekin, or "Northern Capital," and the capital of China has remained ever since.

The modern city consists of the "Nui Chring," or inner city, and the "Wai Ch'ing," or outer city, of which the former is more generally known as the flartar city. The city walls are 30 miles in circumference, vary from 30 to 50 feet in height and from 15 to 40 feet in breadth at the top, and enclose an area of 25 square miles.

The Imperial city or "Hwang Ch'ing" is enclosed within the walls of the Tartar city, and within this again is the "Tszekinch'ing"-the Purple Forbidden City, in which stands the Imperial palace,

Entrance to Pekin is gained by means of sixteen gates, each of which is surmounted by a galleried tower, so constructed as to enable the city guards within it to direct their fire upon any point.

The foreign legations, where one of the most appalling tragedies since that of Campore is now being played outperhaps is already concluded-are sit wated in the right hand lower half of the Tartar City, the British Legation being immediately to the right of the great centre gate leading from the Ohinese through the Tartar to the imperial city.

The mormal population of Pekin is about a million and a half, but these figures have been greatly swelled during the last few months. There are probably not far less than two million people in the city at the present, time, of whom the "foreigners" number thousand all told.

#### THOUSANDS, RULING MILLIONS

More than any other modern nation Great Britain has had experience of dealing with huge-subject populations on an economical basis. In Egypt for instance, her "army of occupation" is only 5,000 men, and her civil ians of all classes only add another 14,000 or so-barely 20,000 to balance, administer, and control a native population of nearly ten millions. The proportion works out as one Britisher to five hundred natives. Compare the French occupation of Algeria, says a contemporary. Algeria has a native population of some three and a half millions policed by some 30,000 French troops, supported by 250,000 French civilians. Proportion, about one conqueror to ten conquered. The Empress dowager (Tsi Hsi) the concubine of the Emperor Huen Feng, who died in 1860. The Empress murdered his widow, the Tsi An, and brought about the death of his son, the young Emperor Tung Chee, by causing his bed to be hung with traperies infected with small-pox.

eneral Yung Lu, Generalissimo of the Chinese army, her factotum and paramour, a former slave of the Emperor Huen Feng, who aided her to achieve the coup d'etat of 1898, and the deposition on January 23 last of The Emperor Kwang Hsu, now reported to
