There was a real hot time old town last night.

Liberal -Conservative disappoint ment at the defeat in West Kent was was largely offset by the victorious elsewhere. On the other hand, the Liberals, although they felt tolerably sure of Pardo's success, did not feel much like celebrating on account of the way the Province was going.

Some enterprising vendors peddled tin borns on the street and the din soon became continual while firezrackers and vigorous lungs were at times brought into pray.

Thousands of people trooped up and down, looking for the news that was not obtainable. It was well on into the night before the last returns

were received.

Almost immediately on the close of the polls a large throng of citizens of both parties gathered at The Planet office to hear the returns. As soon as the messages from all the polling sub-divisions were received The Plan-et extra was issued announcing Mr. Fraser's majority in the city at 27 This was the only accurate and complete city returns published. The announcement occasioned much disappointment to the Conservatives, while the Liberals were correspondingly jubilant. The demand for early Planet extras from all parts of the city kept the presses hustling.

From the very meagre returns, which have come to hand, it would appear that Johns has not proven to be a very serious factor in the contest. The reports from the places yet to hear from, however, will not change the situation of affairs.

The most noticeable changes in the reports so far received are in Howard where completed returns show a majority of 14 for Davidson, This town-ship in the last Provincial elections gave Ferguson a majority of 112. A similar showing has been made in Ridgetown, where Mr. Ferguson's ma-

jority has been reduced from 34 to 33 for Mr. Lee.
Orford, Mr. Lee's own township, only gives an increase in the Liberal only gives an increase in the Library majority of about 9.

No reports have yet been received from Zone or Camden, so that with so many polling sub-divisionss to hear from, it is quite impossible to state any definite result, Thamesville mixes Davidson a majority of 9.
