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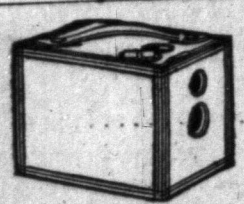

WANT THE MAIL CONTRACT.
Ottawa July 11.—The Elder-Dempster Company, whose steamers have of late been making remarkably fast passages across the Atlantic, have not forgotten to remind the government of the fact that the mail contract was taken from the Elder-Dempster line and given to the Allans because the vessels of the former were not considered fast enough. The Elder-Dempster people now point out that the Lake Megantic made the passage from Quebec to Rimouski in 7 days from Quebec, beating the Corinthian, and 7 hours, beating the Lake Champlain has beaten the Australasian 8 or 9 hours, and that the Lake Ontario has made a quicker run by 18 hours than the mail steamship Numidian.
