Mr. Cameron (Huron) presented two petitions from the county of Huron to the same effect.

RELIGIOUS INTELLIGENCE.

Home of Interest to Persons of all Creeds. A missionary steamer will be sent to Congo by the English Baptist Missionary Society. It will be launched at Stanley Pool, which is in the midst of a fertile and populous country. The Rev. J. D. McMillan has been appointed Superintendent of Presbyterian Missions for the Congo. He was formerly a missionary to the Moros, and was publicly carried by brigands. Mr. Hasson, who has just been created Cardinal, is the first of his nation to receive that dignity. He is an American, and is Patriarch of the Latin American Continent. He will be distinguished among the members of the Sacred College by his beard. Since the death of Cardinal Gibbons, the only American Cardinal who has been created the Sacred College.
