There were arms and ammunition in plenty, for in his mountain strongholds at Tazerant in the Beni Aros mountains and the Fondak of Wadi Ras, Raisuli had gathered the spoil of many affrays with the Spaniards. These bore good fruit, and Raisuli was granted \$250,000 a year and a complete pardon. It was hoped that this would see the end of the struggle, and that the rebellious Moors would devote their energies to less warlike pursuits.
