The Mary Ann, Townsend, master, from Bridgewater, arrived here Monday last, with a cargo of shingles to Mr. John Pearce.

The French Shore trader Annabella belonging to Messrs. J. & R. Maddock left here the 3rd inst., with a full cargo provisions and shop goods for St. Anthony.

A Reception took place at the Presentation Convent Chapel on last Wednesday—when Miss Alice Phelan St. John's, received the white veil of the Presentation Order from the Most Rev. Dr. Power, assisted by his priests.—Nfld.

A house took fire this morning at about six o'clock, in the vicinity of King's Road and was totally destroyed. A three year old child was burned in bed notwithstanding many efforts that were made to save it.—Ibid.

On Sunday morning a man named Milly went down on the Queen's wharf and sat on a piece of timber lying near the edge of the wharf. He had not been long there when he fell asleep and soon fell into the water, where he appeared helpless and would have sunk immediately had it not been for the assistance of Mr. John Walsh who got down at the side of the wharf and held the drowning man over water, with the assistance of a seaman of H. M. S. Flamingo, named Mr. John Barshall, the latter having jumped into the water to the rescue. They landed Milly on the wharf, where the doctor of the Druid attended and did all in his power to recover the man. He gave it as his opinion that the patient would not live, as the water had got in on his lungs. He is now in a precarious state.—Ibid.

We are informed that Lovell's Advanced Geography (143 pages) will be published on the 18th inst. It will contain 45 Colored Maps, 210 Illustrations, a number of Statistical Tables, and a Pronouncing Vocabulary. Price \$1.50.

During the week there has been some improvement in the work of the hook-and-line, and bait has been plentiful. Information has been received from both north and south of an encouraging character. In and about Ferryland, the seines have been nearly all converted into traps, averaging from 300 to 1000 qts. More recent accounts from the same quarter, show that hook-and-line men were improving their work. The same may be said as regards the shore pretty well round to Trepassay.

From an arrival at Harbor Grace last week from the west coast and Straits the Standard learn that the fishery on the West Coast has not been good, the average catch being about 50 qts., a boat. From St. Anthony to Quirpon the voyage has been somewhat better; and from Quirpon up to Flowers Cove, it has been better still—about 80 qts. a boat. The prospects of a good fall fishery are encouraging on the whole extent of the coast mentioned.

The salmon fishery on the French Shore and Labrador has been poor, the fish having been scarce on all parts of the coast. The prices offered for salmon were high; some of the Halifax traders were giving as much as \$14 a barrel for tallow.—N. Star.

We learn from the Newfoundland Standard that on the 23d inst., the steamer Plainmeller, from Montreal to London, ran down a fishing boat belonging to Finley of Peimouse off Cape Bolland. Immediately after the crash the Captain stopped the steamer to ascertain the damage and found the mainmast carried away and hull injured. The captain told him to submit his claim to the agent at St. John's, Mr. McKay.

From the Halifax Herald we learn that the schooner Alta, one of the cable carriers between Antigonish and St. John's Nfld., left Bayfield on Tuesday, 19th ult., at 6.30 p.m., went to St. John's, sold her cargo, and returning arrived at Antigonish at noon on Saturday the 23th, having made the round trip in 8 days and 18 hours, the quickest ever made between those ports.

The S.S. Arctic, Capt. Adams, arrived at Dundee from the whale fishery on the 26th ultimo. The Arctic left Davis Straits on the 13th. Here is the captain's report:—

TELEGRAPHIC.

HALIFAX, N. S. Sept. 5.
Hehenzollern as heir to the Romanian throne.

Turkish troops were concentrating on the Greek frontier.

Ayoub Khan has written to General Roberts apologizing for attacking General Burrow's brigade and asking leave to retreat. Roberts demands unconditional submission.

A naval demonstration against the Albanians will be made on the 15th inst.

A bridge over the Ebro, Spain, fell while a military company was crossing, and 70 soldiers were drowned.

The Irish Land Commission commenced taking evidence yesterday.

The French religious orders have signed a collective note declaring obedience to the existing institutions and submission to the recent Government decrees.

The charred remains of a woman, supposed to have been murdered, were recently found near Annapolis. The woman's name unknown.

Sept. 4.
A battle between the British troops under General Roberts and the Afghans under Ayoub Khan has been fought near Candahar. Roberts defeated Ayoub's forces, inflicting severe loss and capturing twenty-seven guns.

Jamaica has been visited by a terrible hurricane.

Mr Gladstone's health is thoroughly restored. In a speech at Leith, yesterday, he stated that Britain, France and Italy are prepared to mediate between Peru and Chili.

Sept. 6.
General Roberts attacked Ayoub Khan on Wednesday. The Ninety-second Highlanders led the advance and in three hours the Afghan camp was captured. Two hundred and ten British guns were recaptured.

The French Government have granted a subsidy of one hundred thousand dollars to the steamers running between Canada and Havre.

It is said that Baroness Burdett Coutts is ill.

The amendments of the Commons to the Bull and Game Bills have been accepted by the House of Lords.

Callan, Home Minister, entered the House of Commons in a state of grandeur and denounced the numbers as infidels, Presbyterians and Non-conformists. He was expelled by the Sergeant-at-Arms.

Mr Gladstone attended the House of Commons on Saturday.

The Grand Duke Nicholas has been compelled to resign command of the Imperial guards in consequence of corruption.

The steamer Vera Cruz foundered in a hurricane off the coast of Florida. Seventy-two persons were drowned.

Sept. 7.
Ayoub Khan's defeat was complete. He is now retreating towards Herat with a small body of desperate horsemen. All his guns were captured.

The Lancashire weavers are resolved upon a strike. It is expected the masters will order a general lockout.

The railway between St. Petersburg and Semperopol was guarded by fifty thousand troops during the Emperor's journey to Lvadia.

A cordial conference has taken place between Baron Haymerle and Prince Bismarck.

One hundred and ten Spanish soldiers were drowned by the recent potato catastrophe.

Seventeen warships are assembled at Ragusa ready to make a naval demonstration against Turkey.

Sept. 8.
Parliament was prorogued yesterday. The Lord Chancellor read the Queen's Speech. The Speech says the splendid victory of General Roberts will, in all probability, terminate the Afghan war. It also anticipates the revival of trade and an increase of revenue.

The International Commercial and Industrial Congress met at Brussels yesterday.
