

ENTRANCE EXAM.

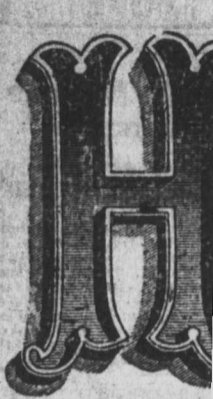
