



Large Quantity of Ammunition.

On the base of both kinds of cartridges are the letters "D.W.M." indicating that they were manufactured by the Deutsche Waifen and Munition Faoriken, a large German concern which manufactures Mauser rifles and the ammunition packets that contain them are, in the case of the rifle ammunition, marked "Fertig Metall Patronen," or ready metallic cartridges, together with the name Calcutta, and the description. "Ausfehrgut," or goods for export.


