The British Loan.

The New York Evening Post says: To-day's cables did not give sufficient details for determining just how far the large subscription to the new British war loan was a result of ordinary and unconditional bids of investors, and how far for the purpose of enabling subscribers to convert an equivalent amount of their old Government bonds into the 41/2 per cent. This is an interesting question, because subscribers of the last-named class have to pay up in full before they can effect such conversion, whereas other subscribers may pay in 10 and 15 per cent. instalments, maturing between now and October 20. To the extent that the subscriptions was made up by investors with consols and the "first war loan" to convert, the influence on the London money market of the initial payment, on July 20, will be the greater. The monev rate at London remained unchanged to-day at yesterday's relatively high figures.

The subscription fairly introduces cne of the real tests of the economic situation. Beginning with last autumn, the German Government has put out \$3,500,000,000 in 5 per cent. bonds, and the English Government \$4,675,000,000 in what may be classed as 41/2 per cent. When it is considered that the largest total amount of new securities even taken in any single year has been \$800,000,000 in Germany, and \$1,335,000,000 in England, the extraordinary nature of the present episode may be better judged. It has resulted already in the dislodgement of the investments of both countries in the securities of outside nations, and we have been feeling the pressure on the New York stock and bond market.

It still remains to be seen how much further this movement will go. But it is certainly a striking fact that the announcement of the huge subscription to the English loan should have been accompanied in New York to-day by a rising market for stocks and a notably firm and steady market for bonds.
