Each Other's Relatives.

"He takes everything that my people do for granted," a young wife said to me the other day. "But if his mother does anything for me, he expects me to positively gush over it. If I don't, he says I'm ungrateful."

Whether she exaggerated or not, I don't know. Probably there was something to be said on the other side of the case. There usually is.

But I quote it for this purpose, to illustrate the antagonism which so often exists between husbands and wives on the subject of each other's relatives.

Sometimes there is open criticism and fault finding.

A Handy Weapon To Hurt With

Underbred people are quick to pick up this handy weapon when they want to hurt each other.

Nothing could be in worse taste. And nothing could leave deeper wounds.

Any one with family feeling—and any one without it is not much good—will resent having his or her family criticised even if he knows the criticisms are well founded. He may admit these things in his own heart, but he will not permit others to say them. In some fine, blind way, he feels that would be dishonorable.

Of Course Family Feeling Should Not Make One Unjust.

Of course you understand that I do not justify the husband (or wife) who permits his relatives to treat his side partner unfairly. In a case like that, he has no right to stand up for his family, but should stand with his

wife, admit her wrong and demand fair treatment for her.

I am referring now to cases where one side partner tries to hurt the other by running down his family.

Sometimes people who have too much self-restraint to do this openly will do it in a more subtle way. By veiled references, by their manner of speaking of these people, by the constructions they place on their acts, they make plain their feeling of antagonism, each to the other's relatives.

Some Antagonism Is Natural.

To some degree, I suppose this antagonism has to exist. These two people came together out of different environments, with different traditions and inheritances. They love each other, but there are things they do not feel the same about and their families are the personifications of these different points of view.

But one does not need to feed and encourage this antagonism. One can overlay it with friendship and generous feelings, and one can faithfully try not to show it in any way.

Twenty Good Divisions With Good Leaders,

COULD ALTER FACE OF WORLD.

London Times Military Correspondent Cannot See Where Hindenburg Will Get Troops to Improve Position of Enemy on Any Front—Russia, With Immense Reserves, Opening Way From Sofia and Constantinople — Roumania Holding and Administering Fifteen Departments Wrung From Austria-Hungary.

London, Sept. 23.—The Times military correspondent says:—

"A correspondent of a German paper says that September is likely to prove the difficult month. He seems to have hinted that events of the later autumn would place a different complexion on affairs. The German commander naturally desires to resume the initiative which dropped from his predecessor's hands with the failure at Verdun, but for the moment he is not a free agent.

"In the west there will be probably a month of good campaigning weather. Much may happen if the Anglo-French allies continue the present rate of progress. It is impracticable that Hindenburg feigns indifference in this struggle, however much his mind is set upon the east.

"We learned from the French report the other day that the German division entrained for the east had been fetched back to the Somme and was then thrown into the fight and had been badly cut up. Since then the Anglo-French advances has been considerably evident. Hindenburg in common with the whole German press, underestimated the dangers of this attack. He might have recalled other divisions for, though Germans would gladly go back to the Meuse if they dared, they do not dare, on account of the moral effect of retreat and because the coal and iron districts which they would have to evacuate are too valuable to be given up. No success gained by Hindenburg in the

east would compensate the public mind for retreat in the west, nor is it an easy matter for Hindenburg to withdraw troops from the Russian and Italian fronts for operation against Roumania.

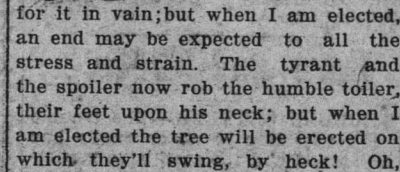
"The whole pulse of the German official mind at present is to pretend to ignore the test where it is known that victory is unattainable.

"With Russia opening a road from Sofia to Constantinople as the winter season draws on, the main Russian front probably is safe. There are immense reserves upon which to draw. Russia was never in a better position to gratify her ambition of centuries. Twenty good divisions with a good leader could now alter the face of the world. Even if the enemy's press strives to magnify the importance of the Balkan front to distract the eyes of the world from the principal theatres of war it remains true that the final decision will take place in the west."
