Council throwing out by a vote of 9 to 7 the Profits Tax introduced by the Government, opened yesterday.

men suffered a horrible death. The scene was too much even for the U-boat commander, for he closed the trapdoor of the conning-tower and submerged. Fiften hours later the sole survivor of the Mariston was rescued by a British steamer.
