THE VICTORIA'S CREW

Arrives at Valletta, Malta-Cheered by

the Crowd.

Valletta, Malta, June 30.—The British cruisers Edgar and Phaeton, belonging to the British Mediterranean squadron, arrived here to-day, having on board the surviving officers and crew of the battleship Victoria Hundreds of small boats conveying relatives and friends of the survivors and a number of relatives of those who had loss their lives put outside the harbor to meet the warships. The survivors crowdes along the bulwarks of the cruisers, calling to their friends in the small boats Cheer upon cheer broke from the crowds of the shore, and they were taken up and repeated by those on the cruisers. Business was partially suspended in the city. A number of natives of Malta were in the crew of the Victoria, and it is known new that 90 Maltese went down with the ship.
