THE VICTORIA'S CREW

Arrives at Valletta, Malta-Cheered by the Crowd.

VALLETTA, Malta, June 30.—The British cruisers Edgar and Thacton, belonging to the British Mediterranean squadron, arrived there to-day, having on board the surviving officers and crew of the battleship Victoria, Hundreds of small boats conveying relatives and friends of the survivors and a number of relatives of those who had lost their lives put outside the harbor to meet the warships. The survivors crowded along the bulwarks of the orulesrs, calling to their friends in the small boats Cheer upon cheer broke from the crowds of the shore, and they were taken up and repeated by those on the cruisers.
