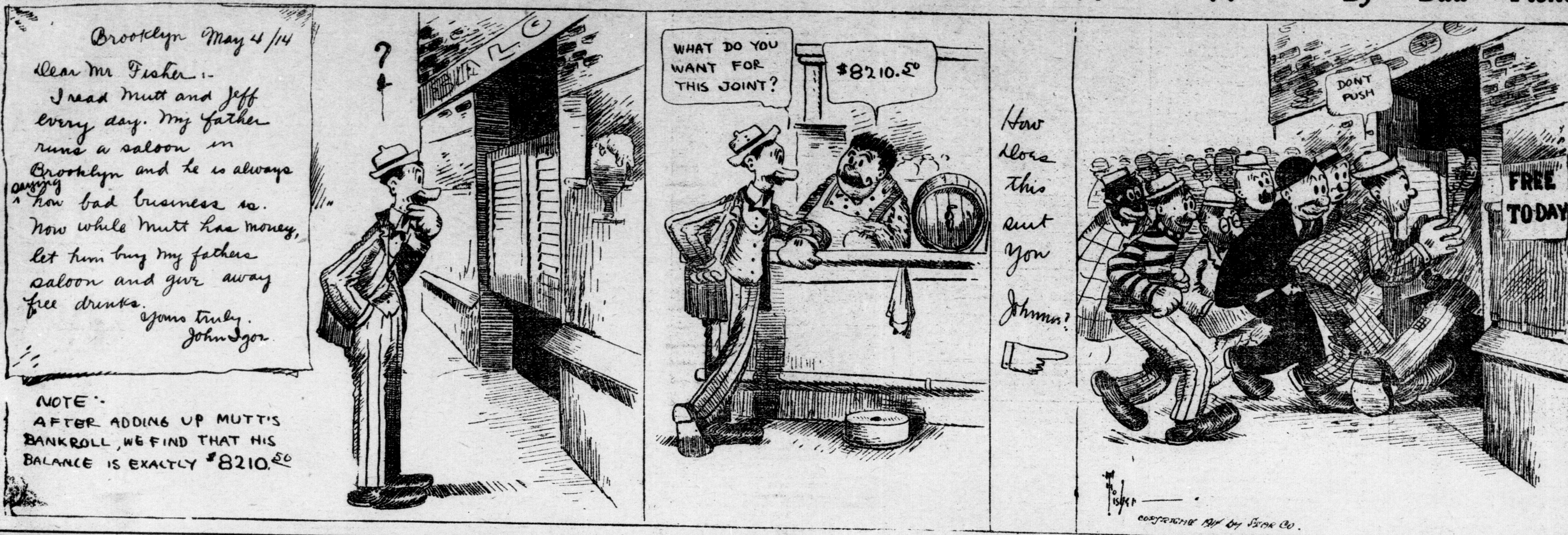

PARIS, May 8.—Reports that the championship fight between Jack Johnson and Frank Moran had been cancelled were denied today by the champion, who said that the bout would be staged on June 27. Johnson has been assured \$40,000.

The fight will be carried out under the rules of the French boxing federation and it is expected that a number of sporting men will come here from the United States to witness the affair.

Johnson has gone into hard training for the first time since he prepared for the Jeffries fight.

## MANAGER O'DAY, OF CUBS, PROTESTS PITTSBURG GAME

PITTSBURG, May 8.—It became known tonight that Manager Henry O'Day, of the Chicago National League baseball club, has protested Thursday's game here which the Pittsburgh team won by a score of 7 to 1. The protest was sent to President John K. Tener this morning. Manager O'Day bases the protest on the action of Umpire Klem, who called Mollwitz, Chicago's first baseman, out in the fourth inning after a ball thrown by the Pittsburgh catcher struck Mollwitz as he neared first base. O'Day claims that Klem told Captain Leach, of the Chicago team, that Mollwitz was out, "for being hit with a thrown ball." It later developed that Mollwitz was called out for interference under the three fold rule. O'Day says Klem did not explain the rule to Leach.
