

McGUIRE AGAIN ELECTED HEAD OF LABOR COUNCIL

Makes Fourth Consecutive Year He Has Held the Office.

VOTE WAS UNANIMOUS

International Labor Officials Addressed Gathering, Urging Missionary Program.

Jack McGuire was re-elected last night to the presidency of the London Trades and Labor Council by a unanimous vote of the delegates. This makes his fourth consecutive term of office.

Jim Marsh, international organizer of the Carpenters and Joiners, with headquarters at Niagara Falls, and W. A. O'Dell, international organizer of the Boot and Shoe Workers, who were both present, urged on the council a missionary program among the locals to add enthusiasm to the work of organized labor in this city, and add new members from unorganized labor.

Mr. O'Dell said he recognized a general movement on the part of employers in Canada to flood the labor market and in other ways to disrupt the organization of labor in the Do-

SCHOOL CROWDING CAUSES CONCERN

Several Organizations Join the Board of Education in Consideration.

St. Thomas, Jan. 15.—A delegation comprised of the chamber of commerce, separate school board, city council, trades and labor council and the board of education will visit the Collegiate Institute Friday to inspect the crowded conditions. Three proposals are favored:

First, the erection of a large new technical high school, replacing the present collegiate; second, the erection of a 25-room junior, commercial and technical high school; third, the erection of two 10-room wings on the present collegiate building.

If either the first or second plan is adopted, the government will bear a part of the expense, while the estimated cost of the two wings would be \$100,000 with no assistance from the government. The larger building is estimated at \$400,000, while the smaller building, and the one apparently most favored in the city, would cost between \$200,000 and \$250,000. The board feel that some action is necessary at once, and that by gathering all the governing bodies in the city together some scheme for relief would likely be arrived at.

Fireman Hurt.

George Carroll, a C. N. R. and Wabash Railway fireman, fractured a rib, sustained bad cuts about the head and a scalded face when he jumped from his engine three miles from Ekfrid Wednesday afternoon. Hearing the crash when the front pair of trucks of his engine left the tracks, Mr. Carroll jumped free of the engine, although there was no serious danger. He is in Amasa Wood Hospital.

Technical Education.

Walter D. Schermer, president of the trades and labor council, is preparing to call a meeting of the members and citizens at large to discuss the technical school question. The speaker will be W. K. Sutherland of the hydro-electric department, St. Thomas.

Boys in Trouble.

Two hours after the report was made to the police of the theft of goods from the store of Fred Pratt, 771 Leavelle street, George Fournier, 18, on parole from the St. John's Industrial School at Toronto, was arrested, charged with stealing the goods. He told of breaking the glass in the window and then helping a younger lad through to unlock the door. The older lad was sent to the jail for a week before receiving the sentence. The younger was asked to come to police court again in a week. The father of the boy was sentenced a month ago to the Ontario reformatory for stealing chickens from Andrew Mills of Yarmouth Center.

Infant Dies.

The infant son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert W. Duffin died in Amasa Wood Hospital Wednesday afternoon. The remains were taken to Williams & Sons' undertaking establishment. The funeral will take place at Union Cemetery at 2:30 p.m. Thursday.

Military Ball.

The military ball to be staged a week from Friday gives every indication of being the biggest event of the winter. This will be the first strictly formal ball since 1914. Woodstock, Stratford, Guelph, Chatham and London, along with other places, will be represented. A number from the headquarters staff at London will attend.

Signal Supervisor.

J. J. Killgus, of St. Thomas, has been appointed to the staff of the C. N. R. station at Stratford as supervisor of signal on the Stratford division.

LAY FORGERY CHARGE ON CHURCH ORGANIST

Frank Pfunder Is Arrested in Detroit—Alleged To Blame Liquor.

Windsor, Jan. 15.—"Liquor" is the succinct explanation given by Frank E. Pfunder, 27, for his fall from church organist in this city to check forger.

Pfunder, arrested today in the Strand Hotel, Detroit, where he lived, is said by police to have confessed a number of forgeries. A number of blank checks from several Detroit banks were found in his pockets when arrested.

Pfunder, until last November, was organist of the Immaculate Conception Church in this city. "After I lost my position with the church I went rapidly downhill," he is alleged to have told detectives. "I tried to find work but failed. Drink brought me to this."

Windsor police were looking for Pfunder for two forgeries amounting to \$100. He is alleged to have passed more than twenty bad checks since November.

BISHOP FALLON DIRECTS OPEN LETTER TO KING

Denounces Whole System, Declaring Institutions Would Not Stand Pressure.

FAITH HAS VANISHED

Toronto, Jan. 15.—"I feel that my reply should be given out by Bishop Fallon. It is for him to say," said Premier King tonight, when asked if he had any comment or reply to make to the letter written to him by Right Rev. Bishop Fallon, in reference to the Home Bank failure.

While admitting that he had received a reply Right Rev. Bishop Fallon declined to give it for publication. "I couldn't do that," is all that he said when shown the premier's statement.

An open letter addressed to Premier King from Bishop Fallon of London, has been received by The Advertiser.

Bishop Fallon's letter is a sweeping denunciation of Canada's banking system, including past failure and present circumstances. Bishop Fallon describes himself as spokesman of "the plain people," and writes as follows:

"To the Right Honorable W. L. Mackenzie King, Prime Minister of Canada."

"Right Honorable and Dear Sir,—Shortly before your departure to attend the Imperial Conference the Home Bank closed its doors. A few days after your return the liquidator issued his report on the bankrupt institution. That document, with its statistics of the most discreditable story of the most effect brought misery and suffering to hundreds of thousands of Canadian citizens. Despite government supervision, finance ministers, inspectors, auditors and the Bankers' Association, the Home Bank was able to go on unchecked for more than a decade of years in its career of incompetence, deception or dishonesty, until the whole structure fell to pieces and brought misery and suffering to hundreds of thousands of Canadian citizens."

Home Bank "An Incident."

"The collapse of the Home Bank, however, is but an incident in a financial condition that calls for immediate and effective action. By growing annual reports, by eloquent discourses from general managers, by empty resolutions of uninformed shareholders and by culpable negligence in the finance department the people of this country have been lulled into a sense of security concerning their surplus earnings intrusted to the banks of Canada."

"There is no doubt as to the sense of security. It is futile to allege that the banks that remain are so strong as to ally all mistrust and suspicion. Consider the history of the past ten years. One of our foremost banks was a universal subject of nervous comment; several millions of dollars went from the public treasury to its support. This action was either a measure of commendable prudence or it was plain robbery."

Then followed the unspeakable exposure of the Merchants Bank, an institution that was considered as solid as the Rock of Gibraltar. In recent months the Union Bank and the Standard Bank have written off millions of dollars of losses caused by the speculation of their officers, and which might just as well have been completely wrecked then. Then the Home Bank failed, following quickly on the heels of that event came the disappearance of the Bank of Hamilton, which had reached the limit of its financial endurance. And only a few days ago the Bank of Montreal was saved by the wise decision of the provincial government of Quebec to assist it by a subvention of fifteen million dollars of public money."

The Present Circumstances.

"There is, moreover, nothing in the balance sheets of our existing banks to create a reasoned confidence. Our ten largest banks have an average surplus of assets over liabilities of less than \$12 in every hundred. When one considers that in this small surplus are contained frozen assets, bad debts, loans from which no profit will ever be made, and the inevitable shrinkage in the value of real estate and equipment, it is too much to say that these institutions would under pressure pass from a condition of potential to one of actual bankruptcy. In that unhealthy condition 90 per cent of the population is vitally concerned, and it is a condition that the civil government is bound to effectively heal; the immediate end for which civil government has been instituted is the protection of person and property."

"But how can this end be reached in the matter under consideration? By the simple method of making the banks collectively responsible for the money they accept as deposits. The banks borrow our money without other security than the charters the people give them; they pay no, or a very low, rate of interest. When they loan us our own money they charge us the highest rate of interest obtainable, and every shred of security that can be squeezed from us is rigorously exacted. We are actually made financial slaves by the very power of our own savings. And the bankers gamble with our earnings, and tell us to go whistle when the crash comes."

Has Lost Faith.

"No further faith can be put in

those who have been hitherto our financial guides. They have been weighed and found wanting. And they know it themselves. We are now being told that the banks have no objection to "government inspection," but that the government must bear

the consequent "responsibility." The people of Canada will not tolerate the placing of any such "responsibility" on their government, that is, on themselves. They shall demand an effective guarantee for their hard-earned savings, and they will look to the forthcoming session of the Federal Parliament to exact that effective

guarantee from those to whom these savings are confided. "It may be asked why I should have written this letter. Let me satisfy a very reasonable curiosity. I have noticed that every corporate interest has a mouthpiece. The plain people, to whom I belong, alone seem to be inarticulate and unorganized."

Failing a more fitting representative, I have ventured to make myself their spokesman. And I have strong conviction that I am voicing their sentiments. "I beg leave to remain, right honorable and dear sir, yours faithfully, "M. F. FALLON, "London, January 12, 1924."
