

Drastic Reduction in Expenditures Suggested So as to Meet Revenue

"Commissioners have been appointed on the part of the United States to act jointly with commissioners on the part of Canada in examining into the question of obstructions in the John river between Maine and New Brunswick, and to make recommendations for the regulation of the river thereof, and are now engaged in work.

"Negotiations for an international conference to consider and reach an arrangement providing for the preservation and protection of the fur seal in the North Pacific are in progress."

On the other hand, the cause of complaint against the State of New Mexico, considered injunctions without delay, will be removed by the enactment of a statute forbidding hereafter the suing of any injunction or restraining order, whether temporary or permanent, by any federal court, without previous notice and a reasonable opportunity to be heard on behalf of the parties to be enjoined, unless it should appear to the satisfaction of the court that the delay necessary to give notice and hearing would result in irreparable injury to the complainant.
