Amendments to Lacrosse Rules.

the referee, each shall be allowed to play in any manner allowed by the rules of the game."

RULE 9, Sec. I.—Rescind the last clause in last sentence of this section. "Except in bonn fide change of residence," and add a new sentence as follows, "If a player be a non-resident of the vicinity where the club he represents is located, he shall not be eligible to play with more than one club in any season."

RULE 12.—After the word goal-crease insert the following, "Although not allowed to catch and throw," Change to read as follows (Sec. 1), "No player shall grasp an opponent's crosse with his hands, hold it with his arms or stick or between his legs."

RULE 18. ROUGH OR FOUL PLAY. Sec. 2.—No player shall hold an opponent's crosse with his crosse, run in front of him, or interfere in any way to keep him from the ball until another player reaches it. Sec. 3.—No player with his crosse or otherwise, shall hold, strike or trip an opponent, nor push him with the hand. Sec. 4.—No player shall be allowed to jump at or shoulder an opponent from the side or from behind, while running for or after reaching the ball.
