The total export of spruce for the year fro m
New Brunswick, according to Snowball's Mira-New Brunswick, according to Snowball's Miramichi wood-trade circular, was 293,384,928 superficial feet. This is 38,000 St. Petersburg standards less than last year and 9000 standards below the average of the past 10 years. The decrease has been general from all New Brunswick ports, excepting Richibucto, but the largest falling off has been at St. John 24,000 and Miramichi 11,000 St. Petersburg standards. The decrease in shipments at these two points to Liverpool has been 45 and 63 per cent. respectively. To Irish and continental ports an increase is reported.

The trade of Nova Scotia and Quebec has substantially increased during the past seven years, the total number of superficial feet exported during 1890 being 99,512,924 and 109,338,340 respectively.
