He said the people of Ontario had been specializing rather over much along two lines with regard to live stock Those who wanted milch cows were prone to go in for Holsteins and those who wanted beef raised Durhams. He believed the introduction of a species of milking Durhams would develop in this province a tendency to raise general purpose cattle.

The recent sale of furs at the Provincial Parliament buildings realized \$5,354.05 for the Province. The pelts were taken from animals trapped in Algonquin Park under the direction of the Minister of Lands, Forests and Mines. There were 480 beaver skins, which were caught under special order, and realized \$4,090.50, 89 mink, 5 fisher, 11 marten, 71 muskrat, 12 otter, 8 ermine. In addition, twenty-three pounds of castoreum were sold. This is a secretion found in the beaver, and is used in making perfumes and for medicinal purposes. The bidding was keen, and buyers came all the way from New York. The revenues of Algonquin Park have also been augmented during the past year by the sale of life beavers to several zoological societies. mals have been shipped to New York, Philadelphia and London,

In South Essex an experiment has been inaugurated to bring the school into closer relation to agricultural life. condition of the land, etc., and send to the Corn Show next winter five or more ears out of the crop. You will have much material for arith-metic keeping farm accounts, in composition, in items of business, and in showing the value, privileges etc., of farm life as compared with

urban life. It is understood this plan has been adopted in other places with good results, and it seems a practical way of teaching agriculture as well as subjects in the ordinary school curriculum. It is quite probable that the Department of Agriculture would give similar aid to experiments in other crops in other districts where these crops are the chief ones. The experiment will be watched with interest and if successful should receive the encouragement of every person who comes in contact with rural life.

Ontario's Mortality.

One of the best and most readable government reports that has been issued of late years is being sent dealing with infant mortality in this province, and compiled by Dr. Helen MacMurchy, of Toronto. Dr. MacMurchy has presented some startling facts with candor and clearness. The chapter dealing with the reduction of the infant death rate is an instructive one. Despite all efforts along this line, we still bury nearly 7,000 babies in this province under one year old, every twelve months. The cost of burial of these little innocents is about \$350,900
